MISSION STATEMENT

The Pete Newell Tall Women's Basketball Camp goal is to continue to do what Pete Newell did his whole life-to teach the fundamentals and footwork of the game of basketball to young players. The ability to read a defense and react to the defender's position is a key component of the Pete Newell method. The part to whole teaching method is used beginning with a 1 vs. 0 to 1 vs. 1, 2 vs. 2, etc.

CAMP HISTORY

The Pete Newell Tall Women's Basketball Camp began in 2001 at California State University, Monterey Bay. Pete Newell and Bill McClintock had talked for years about starting a women's camp just like the Big Man's Camp Pete Newell had been doing for 25 years. When McClintock returned to coaching at CSUMB the dream became a reality. Now after a decade of teaching the list of alums is impressive.

The staff has included basketball names like Ann Meyers of UCLA, a four time All-American and basketball Hall of Famer, Pete Newell Jr., a highly successful Santa Cruz California high school coach, as well as Bill McClintock, Christen Roper, Wendy Anae, Mandy Carver, Ruthie Bolton, Chloe Kerr, Nadia Parker and Kali Bennett

CAMP INSTRUCTIONAL FEATURES

- * Fundamentals of passing, receiving, ball handling, and shooting.
- * Footwork from the low post, high post, and wing positions.
- * 1 vs. 1 reading the defense; how to use counter moves.
- * 2 vs. 2 inside-out concepts: down screen, on ball screen, and back doors.
- * 3 vs. 3 inside-out concepts: high-low, block to block screens, and attacking double teams.
- * Progressive teaching which culminates in 3 vs. 3 competition.

PETE NEWELL TALL WOMEN'S BASKETBALL CAMP STAFF

Pete Newell (April 31, 1915 - November 17, 2008)

Pete Newell Hall of Fame basketball teaching legend's internationally recognized drills and instructional techniques for the development of the inside player are coming to Ventura, California.

Pete Newell had an outstanding career as the men's basketball coach at the University of San Francisco, Michigan State, and the University of California Berkeley. He won the NIT championship at San Francisco, the NCAA championship in 1959 at Cal, the NCAA runner up in 1960 again at Cal, and he also won the Olympic Gold Medal at Rome in 1960.

Following his 21 year coaching career Pete served as the athletic director at Cal and filled the general manager and consulting positions with three different NBA franchises. His work internationally with the Japanese Basketball Association earned him the recognition of "The Order Of The Sacred Treasure" from the Emperor of Japan in 1987.

For over 28 years, Coach Newell conducted clinics and camps throughout the world. Most notable have been the Big Man Camps in Honolulu, HI and Las Vegas, NV. The Big Man Camps have provided NBA stars and aspiring college players opportunities to focus on their footwork and fundamentals while concentrating on reading the defense.



Pete Newell Jr.

Pete Newell Jr. recently concluded a highly successful career as the boy's coach at Santa Cruz, Ca. High winning over 500 games and reaching the central coast section playoffs 20 times culminating in State Division 3 Boys Championship in 2005.

Pete's teaching style emphasizes the importance of mastering the mental aspects of the game and solid preparation through the fundamentals. Pete was a star forward at San Jose State during his collegiate playing days and played for Sub-Pac during his Navy career.



Ann Meyers

Ann Meyers is one of the true pioneers in women's basketball, a Hall of Famer and an award winning broadcaster. Ann is in her sixth year as General Manager of the WNBA's Phoenix Mercury (won the WNBA Championship in 2007 and 2009) and in addition she has been named Vice-President with the Phoenix Suns.

As an amateur, Meyers was the first woman to receive a full Athletic Scholarship from UCLA. She was a four-time Kodak All-American, the first male or female to receive that honor. Upon graduation she held 12 of 13 school records and led the Bruins to a National Championship in 1978. Meyers was the first female to be named to the schools athletic Hall of Fame and had her jersey, #15, retired.



Will Cowen

Will Cowen is a nine-year veteran of the Pete Newell Camps, working with high school, collegiate and professional players. He is currently the Athletic Director at Ventura College, where he also coached the men's basketball team. He spent 14 years as a high school coach, leading the Pacifica HS girls in Oxnard to the 2007 California State Tournament.

Bill McClintock

Bill McClintock was a starting forward on Pete Newell's NCAA championship Cal Berkeley team and the 1960 NCAA runner up. As a collegian McClintock set a Pac-8 (now the Pac-10) rebounding record in 1961 that stood until broken in 1967 by then UCLA sophomore Lew Alcindor a.k.a. Kareem Abdul Jabbar.

McClintock has coached at the high school level as well as the NCAA Division I level University of San Francisco which made a Sweet 16 appearance in 1972. He has also been an assistant coach at San Jose State and most recently the head coach at Cal State Monterey Bay. In addition he has taught at clinics and camps throughout his career.

Bill specializes on moves for the inside player. He teaches rebounding, footwork, and positioning.



Christen Roper

Christen Roper was a graduate of Nordhoff High School in Ojai, and was a four-year starter for the University of Hawaii (1999-2003). She holds school and league records for blocked shots. She has played professionally in Europe for eight years, and coached at Mercer University. She is an excellent teacher and also demonstrates all the camp post moves. She is an ex-Pete Newell Tall Women camper.

Ned Mircetic

Ned Mircetic is the head women's coach at Ventura College. He is the winningest coach in the history of California Community College women's basketball. He has led the Pirates to six state championships since 1996, and was an assistant coach for the 1987 VC men's state title team. In 26 years at VC as a head or assistant coach for the men and women, Mircetic has won 27 Western State Conference crowns. He was also named the 2009 Russell Athletic WBCA National Coach of the Year.
